

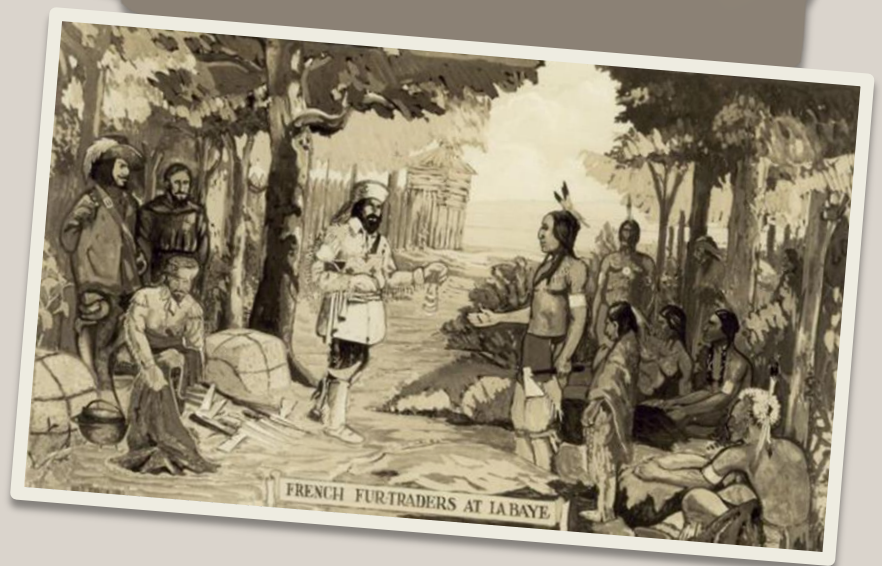


The Fur Trade in Wisconsin
